Three years after the Civil War ended, on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of Union veterans — the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) — established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the war dead with flowers. Maj. Gen. John A. Logan declared that Decoration Day should be observed on May 30. It is believed that date was chosen because flowers would be in bloom all over the country. The first large observance was held that year at Arlington National Cemetery. Decoration Day has turned into our modern day Memorial Day.

4. Campaign sign preparation, distribution and removal
5. Political work while at Federation meetings
6. Volunteering at any county, state, or federation HQ
7. Presenting political programs or speeches at local civic clubs
8. Running for office (all time spend campaigning)
9. Volunteering for a republican candidate for a non-partisan office (i.e.: school board, or city council)
10. Volunteering for a republican candidate in any capacity
11. Voter Registrar
12. GOTV (Get Out the Vote) participant

All we need is a number; you do not have to list every activity. Just go on our website and hit the button to report!
